Whether you're interested in art, history, beach relaxation, or simply soaking in the Mediterranean atmosphere, Nice has a lot to offer for everyone:



- Promenade des Anglais: Stroll along this picturesque promenade, enjoy the sea breeze, palm trees and beautiful views of the Mediterranean and relax on the city's pebble beaches.

- Old Town (Vieux Nice): Explore the narrow streets and colourful facades of the Old Town. Visit the Cours Saleya market, where you can find fresh produce, flowers, and local specialties. Don't miss the chance to sample socca, a traditional chickpea flour pancake.

- Castle Hill (Colline du Château): While the castle itself is mostly ruins, the hill offers panoramic views of the city and the coastline. You can reach the top by climbing stairs, taking an elevator, or walking along the scenic path.

- Place Masséna: This square is a hub of activity, surrounded by elegant architecture, fountains, and vibrant artwork. It's a great starting point for exploring the city.

- Museums: With the Marc Chagall National Museum, the Musée Matisse and the Massena Museum, there's plenty of exhibitions to choose from.

How to get from the airport to the city centre:

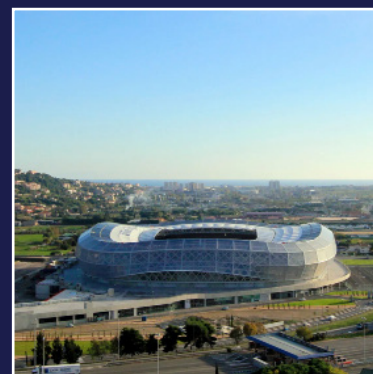
- Tram: Take Tram Line 2 from "Aéroport Terminal 2" directly to the city centre. It runs frequently and the journey takes around 25-30 minutes, with tickets purchasable at the tram station or onboard the tram.

How to get to the Stade de Nice:

- Tram: Take Tram Line 3 towards "Pont Michel" or "St. Isidore" and get off at the "Stade Allianz Riviera" station, which is located right by the stadium.

- Bus: Several bus lines also visit the area, including lines 9, 10, and 95.
